#### **JOINT INFORMATION**

In December 2022, the congregation councils of Henrytown, Mabel First and Scheie voted to participate in a six month "Holy Experiment" during which time Pastor Carla would provide pastoral services to the three congregations. The agreement was later extended for six months. During this time, the churches have been working together in many ways and the Executive Committees have been developing a plan to become a three-point parish. For the most part, the activities and events will continue much as they have during the Holy Experiment with all three congregations making decisions for changes as needed. The Executive Committees have developed an agreement to establish a three-point parish. At the upcoming Annual Meetings, each congregation will be voting to make this a formal agreement.



## MABEL FIRST LUTHERAN COUNCIL

#### November 1, 2023 Meeting Highlights

- Executive Committees from the three congregations will meet on Nov. 5 to consider the parish agreement. They have approved the worship schedule for Christmas Eve (10 AM at Scheie, 4 PM at Mabel First, 5:30 PM at Henrytown) with no services planned on Christmas Day.
- Property and Management is still waiting for completion of several projects at the church. A dead tree
  will be removed from the parsonage property.
- Approximately 24 students have been attending Sunday School. The Christmas program will be presented at an 11 AM joint service on Dec. 10 at Mabel First followed by a potluck meal for all.
- M/S/P to recommend \$7,653.55 of the Steam Engine Days food stand proceeds be placed in the general fund, \$500 be given to SEMCAC for the local senior dining program and \$500 to the Fillmore County Salvation Army Red Kettle campaign. The congregation will vote on this recommendation at the special meeting on Nov. 19.
- M/S/P to elect Lori Schulte, Tyler Mikesh, and Brian Johnson to the Nominating Committee. Three council positions will be open for election this year.
- M/S/P to schedule the Annual meeting for February 4 following worship.
- M/S/P to approve the Food Shelf Committee request to place a mini-split cooling system in their area at their expense.

#### **November 19, 2023 Special Congregation Meeting Notes**

A printed financial report from the Steam Engine Food Stand was presented showing a profit of \$8,760.55. The chairmen and the congregation were thanked for their parts in making this a success. M/S/P to approve the council recommendation for distribution of the profits as cited in the November meeting highlights. This will leave \$125 in the Steam Engine Days account for start-up costs next year.

#### **December 6, 2023 Meeting Highlights**

- The Executive Committees will meet again on December 10. Worship on December 31 will be "Lessons & Carols" with all three congregations meeting jointly at Mabel First.
- The leak in the Education Wing and painting of some outside windows has been completed. There is an issue with the furnace in the parsonage so more repairs may be needed.
- The Sunday School program and potluck has been changed to Dec. 17 at the request of the staff.
- Confirmation students recently visited the Escape Room and had pizza in LaCrosse.
- Review of the guidelines for calling a pastor have begun.
- Discussion was held regarding reducing the number of congregation council members. That would require a change in the Constitution.
- There will be a vote at the Annual Meeting regarding whether or not to have the food stand during Steam Engine Days in 2024. If chairmen are not identified by that meeting, there will be no food stand.
- We have been contacted by two printer companies requesting an opportunity to provide printer services to our church. Estimates have been requested from them and our current provider with a review of our options to be completed at the January meeting.



#### FROM THE INTERIM PASTOR:

1 36What has come into being 4 in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overtake it. 6 There was a man sent from God whose name was John. 7 He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. 8 He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. (John 1:36-8)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and Jesus Christ, the Lord and Savior. Amen.

The season of Epiphany plays with the imagery of light to illuminate our awareness of Christ. At times the imagery of light is more literal. The magi follow a star in search of the anointed one. The heavens are ripped apart at the Baptism of Jesus. Jesus is transfigured into a glowing figure in front of the disciples on the mountain top. Other instances, the image is more figurative. Jesus calls the disciples and illuminates them with a peek at His mission. Jesus teaches with an authority that had not been previously heard – shining a new reality into Scripture.

The image of light denotes revelation – knowing Jesus Christ. The imagery of light also illuminates our lives with the revelation of God in Christ Jesus. God's light shines into our own darkness as well as the darkness of the world around us. We get to see God.

John had a clear-cut trajectory to his life. He was to go out into the wilderness, dress like a prophet (camel's hair), eat like a prophet (locusts and wild honey), baptize, preach, and be martyred. That is what worked in his context. People flocked to him in part because he reminded them of stories they had heard about the prophets of old. Most of us would not be able to pull off that look. I personally can handle the baptizing and preaching, but would prefer to take a pass on the rest. It also highly doubtful that anyone would listen to someone who went around dressed and acting like John did back then. Connotations have changed.

Just because we live in a different context, does not mean we are off the hook. We are still called to testify to the light. Jesus tells us, "<sup>16</sup> In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." We are called to testify to the light by using the gifts each of us has and in the context we live. Our voices join with other believers. We raise our voices and our acts of love; together we testify to the light of the world. We illuminate the darkness with the light of Christ.

The grace and peace of God which passes all understanding keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.
