

Formal classes have been suspended during Lent while students attend and participate in midweek Lenten services.



The Parish Agreement between MFL, Henrytown and Scheie was discussed. Agreement will be reviewed annually by the Parish Board. The vote to accept the Agreement was done by a hand vote and was unanimous.

A call committee will be formed with members from the three churches. If interested on being on the committee, please contact one of the council members asap.

The account that we used for purchasing KWIK Trip cards will be closed and put into a CD at this time. It will be decided at a later date to what account it will go to...ie general fund or cemetery. We will no longer sell cards.

Thinking ahead.....We have not discussed the possibility of having an ice cream social this year or not. If there are individuals interested in planning and working the event, please contact the council.

The council welcomes thoughts, ideas, and concerns from our members. We welcome members to offer their assistance with church services such as reading, serving communion and ushering. Also delivering meals on wheels. Please feel free to contact anyone of us. Council meets the 2nd Sunday of the month after church services. Church service is at 8am in March, 9:30 in April and 11 in May. Rotation continues with these 3 times throughout the year. Communion is the first and second Sunday of each month. Coffee is the first Sunday of each month; after church services for 8 and 9:30; before 11am service.

Supper will be served before Lent service. This will rotate between the 3 churches. See schedule.

MABEL FIRST LUTHERAN COUNCIL

January 3, 2024 Meeting Highlights

- Executive Committees from the three congregations will meet on Jan. 7 to finalize the parish agreement so it can be brought to a vote at the upcoming annual meetings.
- Property and Management: The elevator inspection has been completed with no issues noted. The outside lights above the west steps are not working and need to be replaced.
- Youth & Education: The Sunday School Christmas program went well and was well-attended.
- Proposals for service contracts and replacement of the current printer were obtained after contact with companies requesting consideration of their services at the end of our contract term. M/S/P to retain the current printer and continue the contract with Tri-State Business Machines. A request will be made to change from a monthly base rate for copies to a quarterly rate.
- No update on modifications in the Food Shelf area.
- M/S/P to accept three photos of the church building donated by Andy Sollien.
- Consensus provided for school personnel to use the library for a short period of time for 1-1 instruction.
- February council meeting changed to Feb. 1 to allow necessary actions before the annual meeting.

February 1, 2024 Meeting Highlights

- The 2024 Mission budget was presented for discussion. M/S/P to accept the budget as presented and recommend approval at the Annual Meeting.
- Youth and Education: Plans are for a joint worship service with Scheie at 11 AM on Palm Sunday with the Sunday School students singing during the service. The seventh and eighth grade confirmation students will be meeting separately with each class meeting twice a month when classes resume after Easter.
- Property and Management: They are waiting for replacement lights. A new lock has been installed on the west door of the education building.
- M/S/P to recommend approval of the Parish Agreement at the Annual Meeting.
- Mabel Telephone will be upgrading service to the church in the immediate future and has made some recommendations for changes as part of that process. M/S/P to discontinue the FAX line, rent an internet router from the telephone company, and install an extender in the Sunday School room. There will be some savings as a result of the changes.
- Since a decision regarding the Steam Engine Days food stand needs to be made soon to be fair to everyone impacted, the council recommends there will be no food stand this year if volunteer leaders are not identified by the Annual Meeting.
- March Council meeting changed to February 28 following Lenten services at Mabel First Lutheran.

February 4, 2024 Annual Meeting Highlights

- The proposed Parish Agreement was approved.
- M/S/P to forego the Steam Engine Days Food Stand in 2024 due to lack of leadership/workers.
- Jolyn Mikesh and Michael Kowalsky were elected to the congregation council. One council position was not filled.
- Members are still needed to serve as Memorial Secretary and on the Nominating and Audit Committees.
- Up to two delegates are needed for the Synod Assembly in May.

OTHER

March is Minnesota FoodShare month and the **Mabel Area Food Shelf** is able to receive additional funding for their program based on the amount of donations received between Feb, 26 and April 6. As a result, the Food Shelf has scheduled a **Drive-up Food Drive** on **Saturday, March 30**. Food, household staples, personal care items and monetary donations will be accepted at that time—or at any time during the month if that is not convenient. The calendar provided for the Reverse Lent activity can provide suggestions for needed items. Persons participating in the Reverse Lent activity can drop their items off that day or at their church throughout the month.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Grace and peace to you from God our heavenly Father and Jesus Christ the Lord and Savior. Amen.

Congratulations in this exciting point in your congregational life. All three congregations passed the Parish Agreement at their respective annual meetings. We now step forward onto the next leg of our journey together. Like all things new and different, it will have moments of excitement and moments of anxiety. It is okay to be both excited and apprehensive. We haven't done it this way before. We are heading into uncharted territory – that is both exhilarating and angst-ridden.

We remember we are part of a larger journey. While we are beginning a new leg of our journey, this journey was begun by others thousands of years ago. It is also a journey that will continue until the second coming of Christ. Many have journeyed prior to us. Many will journey after us. All of those journeys join together into a broader journey. "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ." (1 Corinthians 12:12) We all serve the common purpose of making disciples.

We also remember that God is in control. The prophet Isaiah delivered this promise the exiles, "I will lead the blind by a road they do not know; by paths they have not known I will guide them. I will turn the darkness before them into light, the rough places into level ground. These are the things I will do, and I will not forsake them." (Isaiah 42:16) God makes that same promise to this new parish. Our prayer that 'God's will be done' applies just as much to our ministry together as it does in our individual lives or the world.

Recently someone was describing ropes she had strung throughout their home when her husband lost his sight. These ropes helped guide him and remember where he was and how to get where he was going. They gave him a sense of independence and confidence. In many ways, God gives us ropes to grasp when we feel like we are unsure or apprehensive about where we are or where we are going. The most obvious examples of those ropes are the Holy Spirit, community, and God's Word. Together we are guided by God along this journey.

We also remember that we are blessed to be a blessing. All three congregations have been blessed for the purpose "to equip the larger body for the work of ministry, for the building up of the body of Christ." All of the individuals within the three congregations have been blessed for that same purpose. God blesses us with ropes to guide us. God gives us the strength and courage to follow where God leads us. God fills us with the Holy Spirit. God feeds and nourishes us all as we journey together. Together we proclaim Christ's love and hope.

The grace and peace of God which passes all understanding keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.
