match pastoral candidates & congregations.

May 1, 2024 Meeting Highlights

- M/S/P to authorize the treasurer to use money from the Improvement Fund as needed to pay for the new furnace at the parsonage.
- Property and Management
 - Some major landscape work is needed at the parsonage. Current plans are for the property and management committee to enlist a couple men to help with the work.
 - Due to the cost of insurance, another company has been contacted to provide a bid and it appears the cost will be significantly less than the bill recently received. **M/S/P** to hold a special meeting on May 8 or 9 with an agent from that company to obtain sufficient information to make a decision.
- Youth & Education
 - ♦ Youth will do ditch clean-up followed by a pizza party on May 8.
 - Fifth and sixth grade students have been invited to attend First Communion classes after school on May 2 with First Communion being offered at the May 5 worship service
- The Parish Board decided to participate in the Canton Day Off Ecumenical Worship Service sponsored by the Area Council of Churches in lieu of worship in the individual churches on August 18.
- Baccalaureate will be held here on May 19 at 4:30 PM with Mabel First as the lead host.

May 8, 2024 Special Meeting

Decision was made to transfer insurance coverage from Church Mutual to North Star Mutual Insurance Company at a cost of \$5705 for six months.

June 5, 2024 Meeting Highlights

- Money has now been used from designated funds to pay bills. This will need to be repaid by the end of the year.
- Youth and Education
 - ♦ Four students received First Communion on May 5.
 - Senior Recognition Sunday was held on May 19 with three seniors present.
- Property and Management
 - ♦ The hydraulic cylinders in the elevator need to be repacked. M/S/P to authorize that repair as a safety concern.
 - ♦ There is new water damage on the south wall of the fellowship hall. Efforts are underway to determine the cause and possible fix.
 - There was flooding in the parsonage basement during a recent heavy rain. The gutters have been cleaned and an estimate for installing leaf guards has been requested.
 - ♦ Jessi and Joe of The Plant Lady recently provided suggestions for landscape options at the church and parsonage. An estimate of \$2100 was received to complete landscaping and lawn replacement on the north and west side of the parsonage. M/S/P to approve the plan and schedule the work.
- Discussion was held regarding some of the information requested for the ministry site profile to be prepared as part of the call process. Some information will be congregation specific and some will be parish wide. Consensus was to include some of the questions in the July/August newsletter and to use the worship time during Pastor Carla's vacation to reflect on this and build our profile.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Grace and peace to you from God our heavenly Father and Jesus Christ the Lord and Savior. Amen.

The world is changing and has been changing. The church is in the same boat. In an ironic way, we are fortunate to be officially recognized as being in transition. As much as change causes anxiety, at least we can be up front about it. We are very aware that change is part of our existence.

It takes a ton of energy to hide the fact (or hide from the fact) that things are changing. Many congregations are exhausted by trying to return to a time that is never returning (and was probably not nearly as idyllic as the memories are). There are no magic bullets or programs that will turn back time. For that matter, as much as we honor our histories and learn from them, we are called to be the church now – in this time and place.

In June, I attended a mini-retreat introducing 'Faith+Lead', a ministry of Luther Seminary. The following are Six Commitments of the church as identified by Faith+Lead team. These 'commitments' are timely reminders of 'non-negotiables' for congregations in a changing religious climate. I noticed that these same commitments also highlight truths often taken for granted.

The Triune God *is actively creating, reconciling, healing, and restoring the world.*

God is with us in Jesus and invites us to join in what God is doing.

The gospel of Jesus Christ is a matter of life and death for the whole world.

The Holy Spirit gathers and sustains the local church—and will continue to do so.

God is the primary leader of the local church.

All Christians are called to follow Jesus by joining God's work in daily life.

Anyone notice a common denominator in those commitments? (*Hint*: **GOD**) God is active. God is in charge. God is gathering. God is inviting. God is guiding. God is sustaining. God is empowering. God is inspiring. The non-negotiable for the Church (on earth and in heaven) is very simple - God is at the center. As simple as it is, it may be historically the most frequently forgotten characteristic of the church on earth.

I remember a family whose children (& later grandchildren) learned early on to make sure they were all in the car before mom left the church parking lot. Sometimes Christians try to drive off without God. It can be difficult to remember that not only should God be in the car, but also driving and navigating.

We are called to follow where God leads. Yes, the world changes. Yes, change impacts the church. Yes, we trust that God, who has promised to lead us, will actually do so. As the Hebrew congregations were reminded centuries ago, "Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful." (Hebrews 10:23)

The grace and peace that surpasses all understanding keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.
